Know what's in your well water? In June, 38
Patrick County residents tested their well water and found out. Since private water supplies are unregulated, homeowners are encouraged to periodically test their water quality for safety. Confidential water testing and education was offered through the Extension office in June of 2024. Participation was voluntary. The Extension office was able to offer 40 county residents free water testing and follow up instruction on test results.

This workshop is offered annually. Any Patrick County resident interested in testing their well water in 2025 is encouraged to call the office to be placed on our participant list.
